Hi, I'm Mythily, a Parental Transition Coach at Parent and Professional. I work with parents navigating the transition between family life and career, helping them find balance, build confidence, and create a work-life approach that truly fits.

→ Morning

My day starts with a one-on-one session with a new mother who's on the brink of returning to work. Together, we dive into her thoughts and concerns, working through strategies to balance her role as a parent with her career aspirations. It's incredibly rewarding to see her confidence grow as she feels more equipped for this next chapter.

→ Midday

By midday, I'm hosting a virtual group session with new parents from one of our corporate clients. These group sessions are lively and full of shared experiences. Today's focus is on time management and setting boundaries - a popular topic that sparks lots of practical tips. It's so empowering to see parents exchanging ideas and realising they're not alone in balancing work and family.

→ Afternoon

In the afternoon, I meet with a father who's considering a career shift so he can be more present with his family. We explore his values and priorities, discussing flexible work paths that might align with his family goals. These sessions often bring a lot of clarity, as clients start to see how their professional paths can align more closely with their personal lives. And as for me, one of the greatest rewards of this work is the flexibility to pick up my own children at the end of the day, knowing I'm making a difference in the lives of other families too.

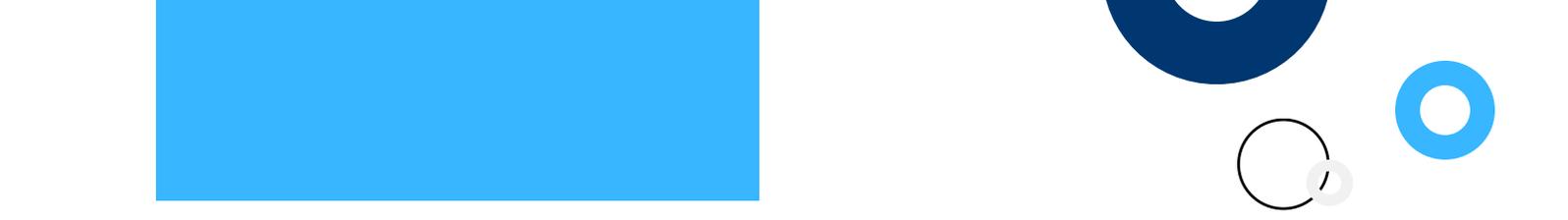
